

Venezuelans who oppose president Chávez collected millions of signatures (several times) to



activate a referendum for a presidential recall, as established in the constitution. After one year of struggle against a visibly biased National Electoral Council (NEC), the referendum finally occurred in August 2004. For the first time in Venezuelan history, the result was based solely on the voting machines that the NEC insisted in purchasing. According to official results, president Chávez's mandate was confirmed by majority. Now the government is using the lists of Venezuelans who signed the petition to threaten and prosecute dissidents. Those who signed the petition are banned from working or doing business with institutes or companies controlled by the state. (State Oil Industry, Governmental Offices, etc.).


